




# Citation index

- A citation index is an index of citations between article publications, allowing the user to easily establish resemblance between documents.

- 
- Some publication available online only, which similarly combines subject searching with citation browsing and tracking in the sciences and social sciences.
  - There are a number of other indexes, more readily available. Some of the currently notable ones are:

- Web of Science by Clarivate Analytics
  - Scopus by Elsevier, available online only, which similarly combines subject searching with citation browsing and tracking in the sciences and social sciences.

- Each of these offer an index of citations between publications and a mechanism to establish which documents cite which other documents.
  - They are not open-access and differ widely in cost: Web of Science and Scopus are available by subscription (generally to libraries).
