Citation index

• A citation index is an index of citations between article publications, allowing the user to easily establish resemblance between documents.

 Some publication available online only, which similarly combines subject searching with citation browsing and tracking in the sciences and social sciences.

 There are a number of other indexes, more readily available. Some of the currently notable ones are: Web of Science by Clarivate Analytics

 Scopus by Elsevier, available online only, which similarly combines subject searching with citation browsing and tracking in the sciences and social sciences. Each of these offer an index of citations between publications and a mechanism to establish which documents cite which other documents.

• They are not open-access and differ widely in cost: Web of Science and Scopus are available by subscription (generally to libraries).
