# ASHRAMA PADDHATI VIDYALAYA

### **ASHRAMA PADDHATI VIDYALAYA**

- Ashrama Paddhati Vidyalayas was established in 1966 by the Education Commission to encourage the education of the children of tribes.
- It is a fully residential school similar to the ancient Gurukul system.
- Here, students stay with the teachers and study in the simplicity and clean environment of the school.

# CHARACTERISTICS OF ASHRAMA PADDHATI VIDYALAYAS

- Ashrama Paddhati Vidyalaya is a centrally sponsored scheme, which is operated under special component plan in states and union territories.
- 2. This includes education up to upper primary, secondary and higher secondary level.
- 3. The total financial assistance is provided by the Central Government for the construction of the Vidyalaya Bhawan, Hostel, Kitchen, Staff Quarters in the establishment of Ashram Paddhati Schools for *Girls* in the States and Union Territories.

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- In states and union territories, the contribution of the central and state government is 50-50% in the opening of Ashram Paddhati schools for boys.
- The central and state governments share 50-50% in financial support for non-recurring items such as equipment furniture and furnishings, hostels and libraries of the Ashrama Paddhati Schools.

# AIMS OF ESTABLISHMENT OF ASHRAMA PADDHATI SCHOOLS

- 1. To spread education among Scheduled Tribes and increase their literacy rate.
- 2. To enable the children of Scheduled Tribes to develop themselves and bring them at par with other castes.
- 3. Educating them and connecting them to the mainstream of society and nation.
- To pay special attention to the education of Scheduled Tribes girls.
- 5. Along with the education of children of scheduled tribes, their physical development.

# ADMINISTRATION OF ASHRAMA PADDHATI VIDYALAYAS

- Initially, the Harijan Social Welfare Directorate handled the responsibility of establishing and running these schools.
- After the establishment of Tribal Development Directorate in 1984, the work of establishment and operation of these ashram paddhati schools is being done by this directorate.

Since the year 2008-09, ashrama paddhati vidyalaya has been decided to run as Navodaya Vidyalaya by the Social Welfare Department in order to provide the education free of cost to the talented students of the poor underprivileged category, and these belonged to the Central Board of Secondary Education.

### **SCHOLARSHIP FACILITY**

- For class 11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> 140 to 170 rupees per month (In case the annual income of the guardian is less than 1,00,000)
