Unlimited depth/endless

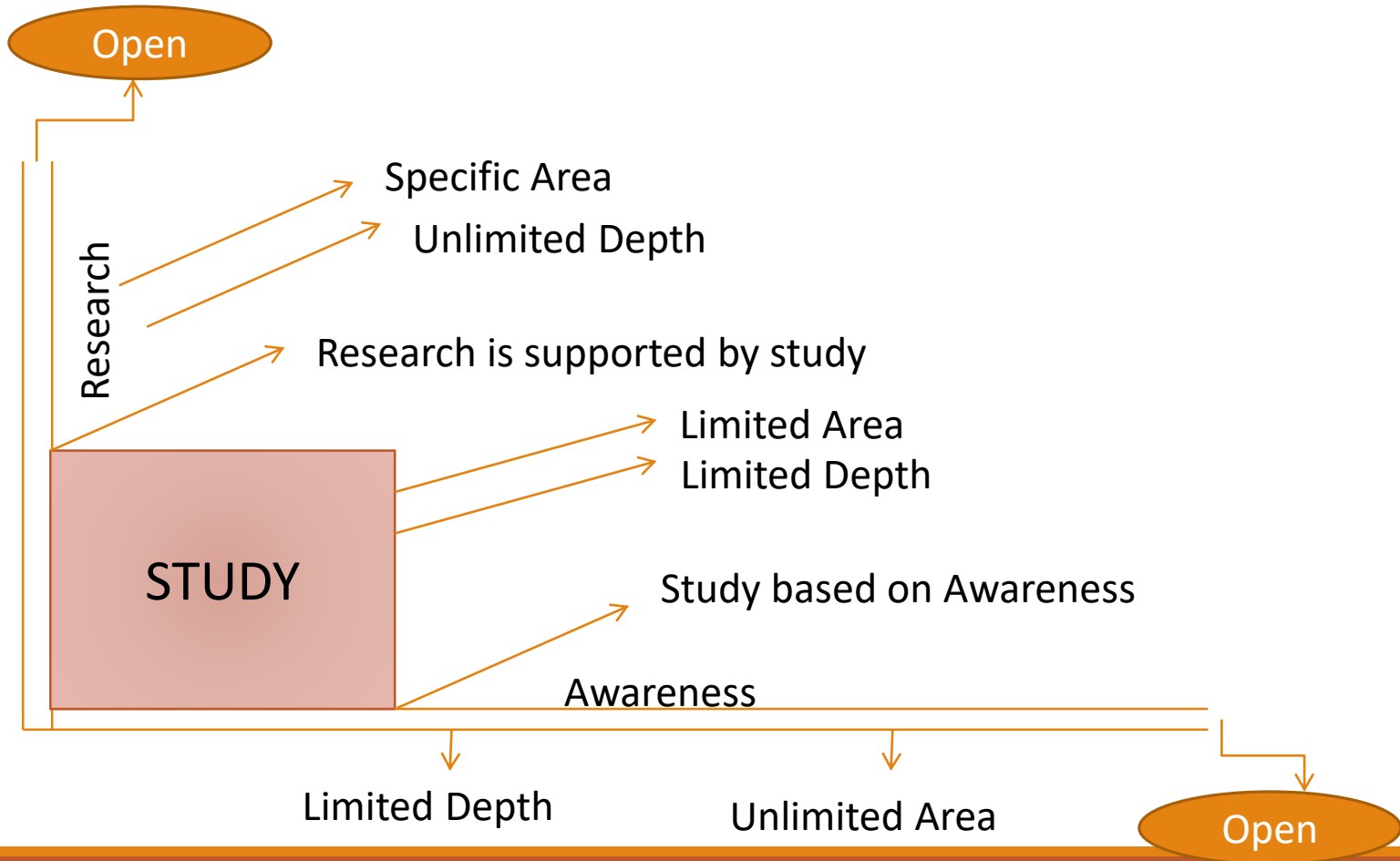
Depth according to education level

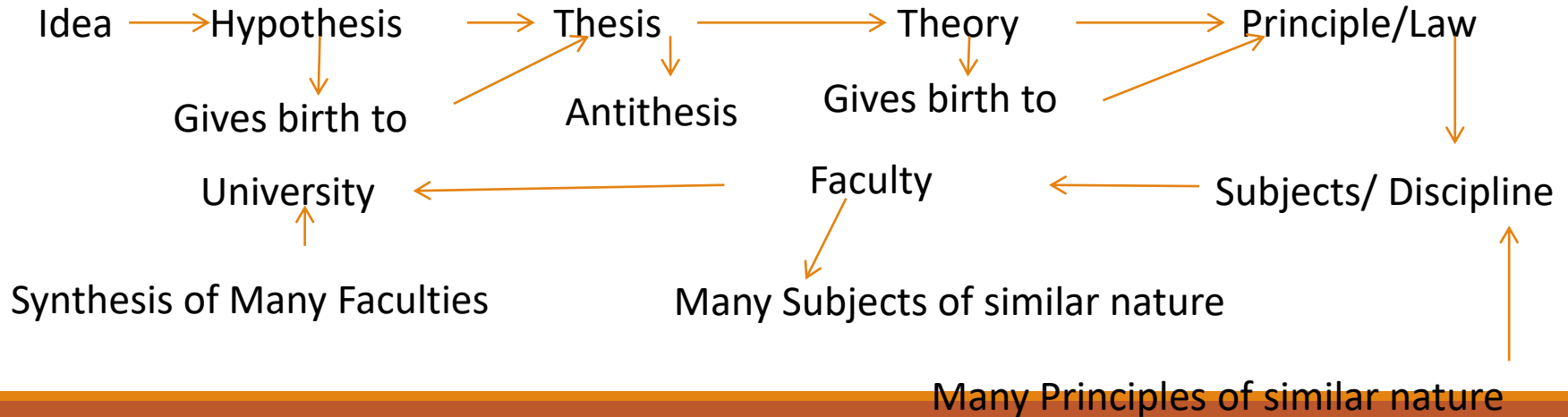



CHARACTERISTICS
