7. ENTOMOLOGY

Brief History of Entomology (in India):-

The word entomology derived from Greek words:

Entomon = Insect

- Logos Study
- Entomology is the branch of science that deals with the study of insects.
- The study and use of insects in crime investigations is known as Forensignentomology.
- The study of insects in relation to human beings is known as Medical entomology.
- Insects came on the earth about 350 millions year ago, while human being appeared on the earth about 1 million year ago.
- Arthropods form biggest phylum of animal kingdom with the highest diversity of species (about 10 Lacs of known species) followed by plants with 3.30 lacs known species.
- However mammals have only 4000 described species on the earth (means we are very less diverse as compare to insects and plants). A second of the least of the l
- Arthropods (insects) were initially aquatic and later became terrestrial.
- 1745-1808- J.C. Fabricus: -He conducted an extensive study of Indian insects for the first time and classified insects in to 3 orders based on the type of mouth parts.
- 1767-1779-J.G. Koenig: He started the regular scientific work on Indian insects and supplied the insect speciemens to systematic.
- 1897-1899-Sir Ronald Ross: He discovered the malarial parasite, Plasmodeum, which is transmitted by female Anopheles mosquito.
- 1901- Lionel de Niceville: he was appointed as first entomologist to govt. of India.
- 1903- H.M. Lefroy: he regarded as second entomologists to Govt. of India and wroate two books 'Indian Inscts Pests' and 'Indian Insect Life' in 1906 and 1909, respectively.
- 1906- Established 'Forest Research Institute (FRI)' at Dehradun
- 1914—Enacted' Destructive Insect-Pests Act (DIPA)
- 1914- Started 'Zoological Survey of India, Kolkata (W.B.)
- In 1925- Established 'Indian Lac Research Institute, Ranchi, Jharkhand (now renamed as' Indian Institute of Natural Resins and Gums).
- 1937- Established 'Division of Entomology' at IARI, New Delhi
- 1937-Hem Singh Pruthi: He was founder of 'Entomological Society of India' and he regarded as 'first Indian Entomologist' to Govt. of India.
