DISTRIBUTION OF DRUGS TO ICCU/ICU/NICU/EMERGENCY WARD

- ICCU: The intensive Coronary care unit (ICCU) is a unit dedicated to the treatment of heart condition such as coronary heart disease, heart attack, cardiac arrest and heart failure.
- 2. ICU: Intensive care unit, life support is provided in an intensive care Unit for Critically ill Patients.
- 3. NICU: Neonatal Intensive care Unit, also known as an intensive care nursery, is a unit specializing in care of ill or premature new born infants. The first 28 days of life are referred to as neonatal.
- I. Emergency Ward:
 - Also known as an accident and emergency department, emergency room or causality department.
 - It is a medical treatment facility specializing emergency medicine, the acute care of patient present without prior appointment, either by own means or ambulance.

Intensive Coronary Care Unit:

- Coronary care unit arose in the 1960s, as it became obvious that constant supervision by highly trained personnel, cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), and medical intervention may minimize death from cardiovascular disease complication.
- Patient who are critically unwell are admitted to the ICCU.
- The availability of telemetry(tracking of heartbeat) or continuous cardiographic monitoring of the heart rhythm, is a key element of coronary treatment.
- Patient with myocardial infarction or unstable angina are commonly admitted to the coronary care Unit.
- Myocardial infarction is the most common morbidity discovered.
- The majority of the medications prescribed were from the WHO'S essential drug list.
- Tablet aspirin is the most commonly prescribed medicine.
 Promethazine, Heparin, hydrocortisone, buprenorphine, streptokinase, metaprolol, pentazocine and frusemide are among the most commonly utilized injections.
 Antibiotics are used less frequently.

Intensive Care Unit (ICU)

The following is a list of the eight most commonly utilized medications in emergency situations:

- Adenosine
- Amiodarone
- Atropine
- Epinephrine
- Lidocaine
- Procainamide
- Sotalol
- Vasopressin

Drug Distribution to these Departments

In Intensive care Units drugs are available already . Only some certain , limited quantity of drugs stored there . They are packed in single unit container . And location are fixed for storage of IV solution for certain drugs .

- The medicines are already distributed in all these care units from pharmacy department
- All the medicines are stored at required condition
- Nurses or pharmacist regularly check the medicines and fills the required medicines with proper documentation
