SRI AUROBINDO GHOSH: LIFE SKETCH, THEORY OF NATIONALISM AND HUMAN UNITY, CONCEPT OF SUPERMAN AND SUPER MIND

Introduction

Sri Aurobindo Ghosh was one of the most important philosophers, spiritual thinkers, nationalists, poets, and social thinkers of modern India. Life Sketch of Sri Aurobindo Ghosh

During his stay in England, Aurobindo developed interest in literature, philosophy, politics, and revolutionary nationalism. After returning to India, he joined the Baroda State Service and later became actively involved in the Indian freedom movement.

Aurobindo emerged as one of the leading nationalist thinkers during the early phase of the Indian independence struggle. He strongly opposed British colonial rule and advocated complete independence for India. Through newspapers such as *Bande Mataram*, he spread nationalist ideas among the people.

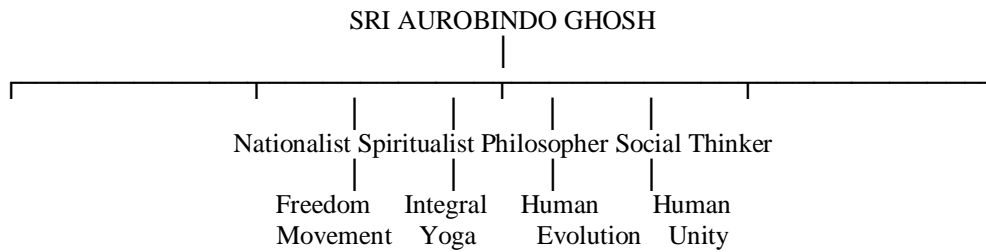

Theory of Nationalism

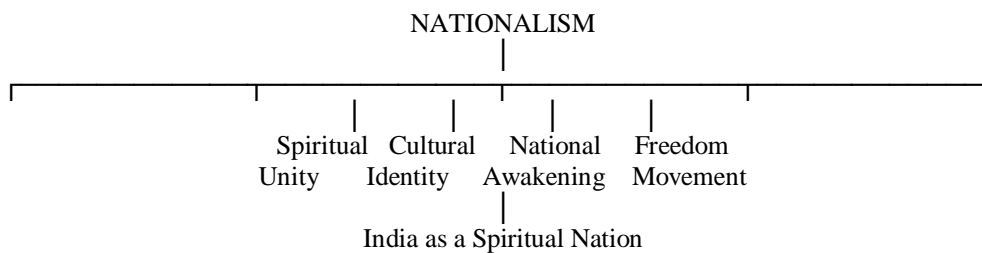
His nationalism emphasized:

According to Aurobindo, the ultimate goal of human evolution is the creation of a spiritually united world society based upon harmony, cooperation, and brotherhood.

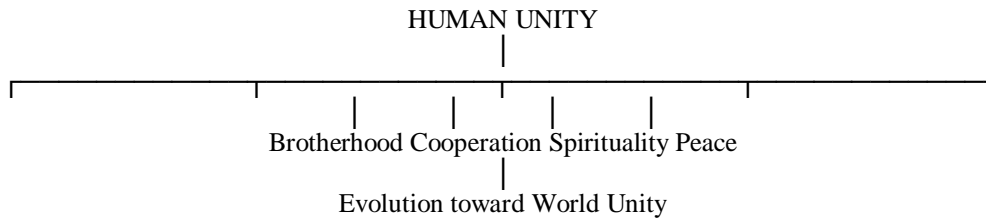
He opposed war, hatred, narrow nationalism, and racial conflict. He believed that humanity must transcend divisions based on caste, religion, race, and nationality.

Unlike Nietzsche’s Superman, which emphasized power and domination, Aurobindo’s Superman is based upon:

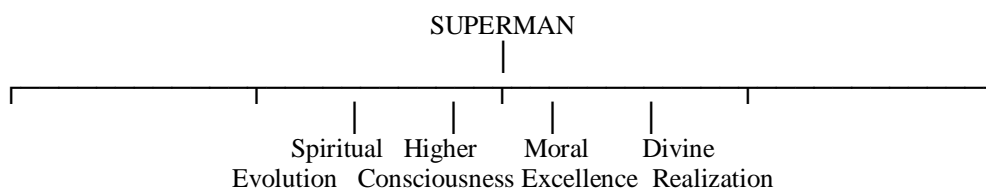
- Spirituality

According to Aurobindo, Supermind acts as a bridge between:

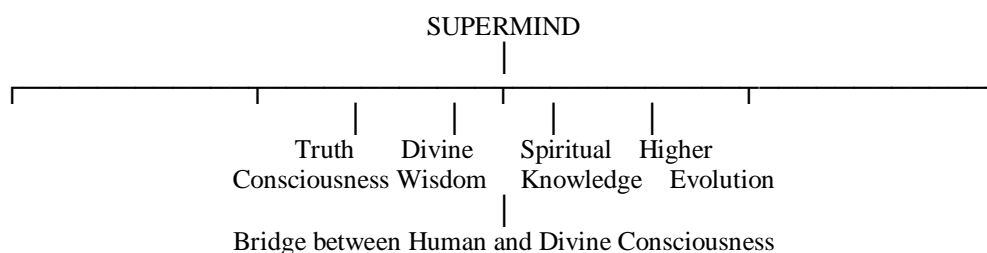
- Human consciousness
